Women's Cricket Round-up

Oman hosted the GCC Women's T20i Championship Cup between 20th and 26th March, 2022. 6 nations, namely Oman, UAE, Kuwait, Qatar, Bahrain and Saudi Arabia took part. Oman Women won 4 of their 5 games to finish second. The matches were also broadcasted live, giving further exposure to women's cricket in the region. Esha Oza of UAE finished as the tournament's top-scorer and Maria Jasvi of Kuwait led the wicket-taking charts. Oman's top performers on a game-by-game basis have been highlighted in the first 5 pictures, followed by Bahrain's record shattering performance.

In the Oman Cricket Women's League Season 2021-22, OWCA Women emerged victorious. They beat ISC Women in the <u>final</u>.
